

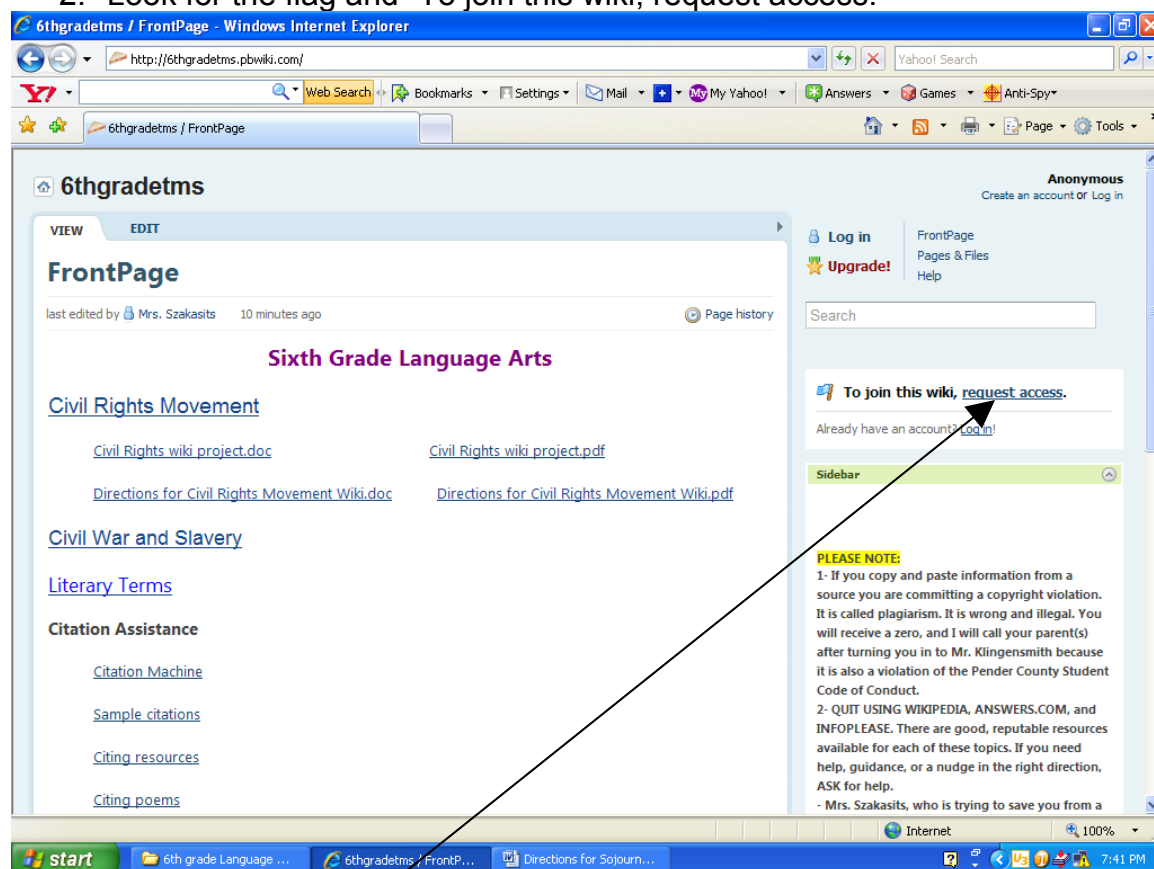
Directions for viewing the Civil Rights Movement Wiki

1. Go to <http://6thgradetms.pbwiki.com/>
2. Click on the link Civil War and Slavery to reach the list of terms
3. Click on the topic to read the information about it.

Note: Use the links under Citation Assistance for guidance when citing your sources.

Directions for requesting access to edit your topic

1. Go to <http://6thgradetms.pbwiki.com/>
2. Look for the flag and “To join this wiki, request access.”

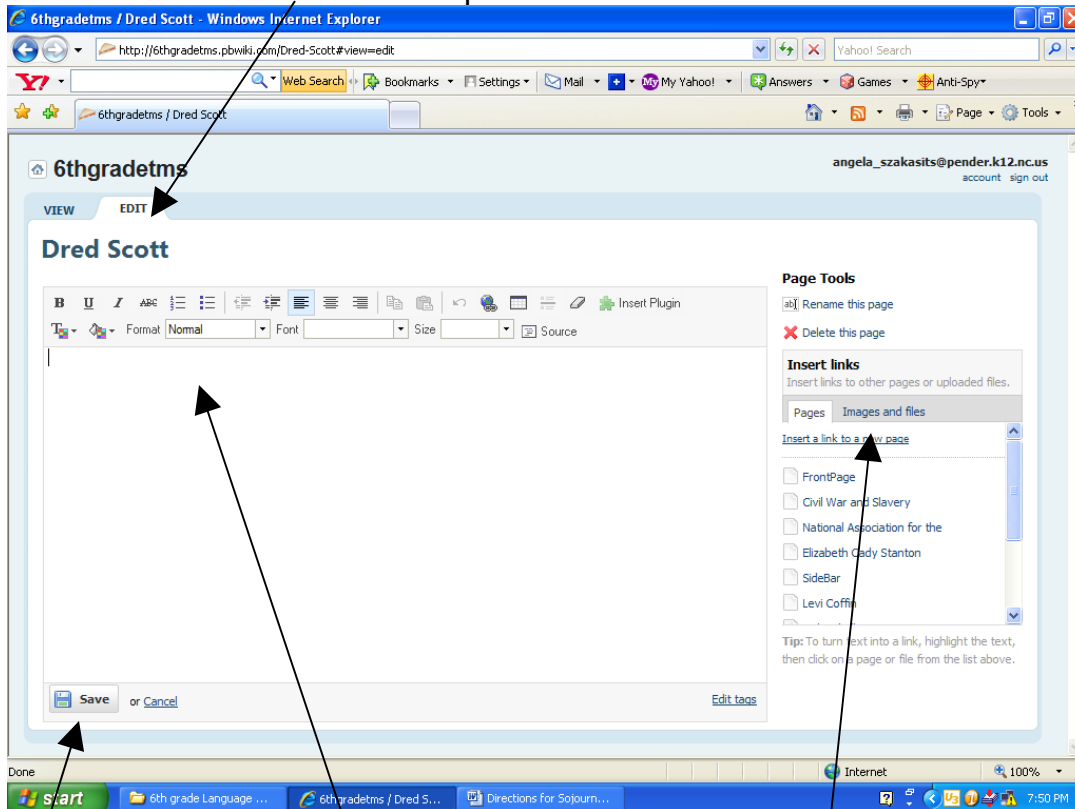


3. Click request access.
4. Enter your email address (or your parent's)
5. In the message box, include your name and your topic.
6. Enter the letter to confirm
7. Click Send to administrator
8. Check your email later to see if Mrs. Szakasits has granted you access. When you receive the email stating you have been granted access, click on the link to join the wiki.
9. Enter your first name and last initial in the box for name.
10. Enter your password.
11. Confirm your password
12. Click Save

Note: If you do not have an email address, let Mrs. Szakasits know. She can set up a user account for you without an email address.

Directions for entering your information in the wiki

1. Go to <http://6thgradetms.pbwiki.com/>
2. Log in with your email address and password
3. Click Civil War and Slavery
4. Click on your topic
5. Click the edit tab at the top



6. Enter your information and proceed to Step 11
7. If you want to upload a file because you typed your information in another program (Microsoft Word or something else), click Images and files under Insert Links on the right side
8. Click Browse and find your file
9. Click the name of your file and click open
10. You should see your file appear in the box under Browse so click the name of the file to insert it on your page
11. Click Save at the bottom of the screen
12. Click the View tab at the top of the page and look at what you've done as others will see it

NOTE: If you get stuck with something related to the wiki, do not let that stop you from working on the project. Continue working, even if it means writing on paper. We can always scan the paper and upload the file. Post questions to the discussion board and email Mrs. Szakasits a description of any problems you have. (Do not shed tears in front of the computer unless it is 11 pm the night before this is due and you realized the errors of your procrastinating ways.)

NOTE 2: Comments you make should be relevant and provide feedback.
